HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

We would like to extend a warm and heartfelt THANK YOU to all our fathers. In a time when the attacks on the family are so heavy, may we all strive to support our fathers and encourage them to stand up as the leaders we need. Let us not forget our priests throughout the world who have dedicated their lives to a special calling of fatherhood as well. May God strengthen our families by strengthening our fathers physically, mentally, and spiritually. According to the Catechism: 2214 "The divine fatherhood is the source of human fatherhood;¹⁶ this is the foundation of the honor owed to parents. The respect of children, whether minors or adults, for their father and mother¹⁷ is nourished by the natural affection born of the bond uniting them. It is required by God's commandment."¹⁸ "

DID YOU KNOW?

On June 22nd, we remember bishop St. Paulinus of Nola (354-431). He is the patron invoked against Demons and Demonic Possession. St. Paulinus was one of the great men of his era, and many other Saints have praised him in their writings. Born near Bordeaux, he married a Spanish woman named Therasia. He was baptized by St. Delphinus. Having been childless for many years, when they finally had a son and then the child died within a week, they determined to spend the rest of their lives in continency, prayer, and works of mercy, and they gave most of their possessions to the poor. As a result, the Bishop of Barcelona ordained Paulinus, due to public demand. Fifty-one of his letters and 32 of his poems remain.

We also celebrate the martyrs Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher on this day as well. Saint Thomas More was an English lawyer, social philosopher, author, statesman, and noted Renaissance humanist. More opposed the Protestant Reformation, in particular the theology of Martin Luther and William Tyndale. More also opposed the king's separation from the Catholic Church, refusing to acknowledge Henry as Supreme Head of the Church of England and the annulment of his marriage to Catherine of Aragon. After refusing to take the Oath of Supremacy, he was convicted of treason and beheaded. Of his execution, he was reported to have said: "I die the King's good servant, and God's first." St. John Fisher was close to Thomas More and was also killed for opposing King Henry VIII's second marriage and his claim to be head of the Church.
