## DID YOU KNOW?

The Catholic Old Testament includes seven books that are omitted in Protestant Bibles. Despite popular belief, the Catholic Church did not add these books to the Bible. These Old Testament Books - Tobit, Judith, 1st Maccabees, 2nd Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach, and Baruch, as well as parts of Esther and Daniel - had been accepted as part of the Bible by all Christians until they were removed by Martin Luther during the Protestant Reformation in the 16th century.



## RIGHT TO LIFE BANQUET



Central Michigan Right to Life will be hosting its annual benefit dinner on Thursday, May 16th at Buck's Run Golf Club. The dinner will begin at 6:00 pm with the doors opening at 5:30 pm. Tickets are \$15 for students, \$25 for individuals, or \$180 for a table of eight. **Guest Speaker:** Ed Rivet

Ed served as Right to Life of Michigan's Legislative Director for more than 30 years, spearheading the organization's public policy efforts at the State Capitol. Ed worked to pass dozens of prolife laws and prevent the passage of laws that violate the sanctity of human life. His legislative accomplishments on abortion include laws regarding parental consent, informed consent, banning partial birth abortion, regulating abortion clinics, protecting babies who survive abortion and more. Ed's work on end of life issues included banning assisted suicide and writing the most protective medical directive laws in the country. Ed is a native of Bay City and earned a bachelor's and master's degree from Michigan State University. He and his wife Michelle live in Mason and are proud of their growing family, with six children, two of whom are married, and three grandchildren. He is currently employed as the Executive Director of the Michigan Conservative Energy Forum.
