END DISMEMBERMENT ABORTION

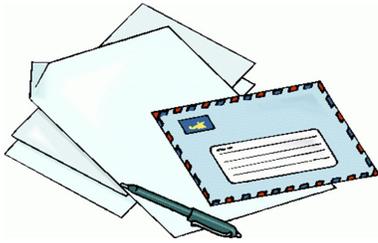

World Mission Sunday:

Today we celebrate what the Catholic Church calls World Mission Sunday! In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. The Mission Sunday collection is always taken on the next to last Sunday during the month of October. This day is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity so Christians the world over will recognize their common responsibility with regard to the evangelization of the world.



You may have noticed that we have two statues on the wall in the sanctuary. They are St. Thérèse of Lisieux and St. Francis Xavier. Pius XI proclaimed St. Francis Xavier “Patron of Catholic Missions,” and St. Thérèse the “Patroness of Missions.” Since both of these saints lived very different lives in terms of travel, one could ask, “Why are they the ones chosen for missions?” Vatican II defined missionary activity in these terms: “The special end of missionary activity is the evangelization and the implantation of the Church among peoples or groups in which it has not yet taken root.” Although St. Thérèse never left the cloister of her convent, her burning desire for conversion of souls was her missionary heart at work. St. Thérèse, once in Carmel, understood her missionary vocation from a contemplative point of view. She writes, “I had declared at the feet of Jesus–Victim, in the examination preceding my Profession, what I had come to Carmel for: I came to save souls and especially to pray for priests. When one wishes to attain a goal, one must use the means; Jesus made me understand that it was through suffering that he wanted to give me souls, and my attraction for suffering grew in proportion to its increase.” Now, one can better understand why she would be included as a patroness of Missions even though she did not travel far and wide physically like St. Francis. It is powerful to think about how her type of missionary work has impacted millions of Catholics worldwide. In remembrance of both of our patrons for St. Mary, we have included posters and donation envelopes in the vestibules so that you can learn about and support the Catholic Missions.

In the Church, we have a beautiful process for anyone who wants to become Catholic. It’s called the **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA for short)**. If you or anyone you know is interested in becoming Catholic, or if you just want to learn more about the Church and her teachings, please let any of the staff members know.

We continue to have a good number of applications being filled out to register with the parish. Remember, you can be registered at more than one parish, especially if you already attend both Sacred Heart and St. Mary liturgies. Since we are attempting to get more involvement from the *whole* community, this is a means to communicate what is going on at the parish on a weekly basis. We send out an email blast through MailChimp that gives a detailed account of what you can expect in a typical week here. We have both Student and Community Member affiliation/registration forms in the lounge and in the vestibules. Please fill these out so we can keep everyone in the loop.
